Classroom Expectations

- Be on time, in your seat, ready to work when class starts. (might include answering a daily question)
- Be prepared with needed materials, supplies, assignments etc.
- Completing work and participation in class is required.
- Show respect for yourself, others, and the classroom/school environment.
- Be courteous and cooperative to all whom are in our classroom.
- Students will speak in an appropriate volume for the task they are engaged in.
- Students will have and complete their planners daily with homework and upcoming tests/assignments.
- Periodically planners will be checked/graded to ensure that they are being used. Planners are graded in homework/classwork category.
- Students will abide by all school rules.

Tardy Policy

Students must be in the classroom and **PREPARED FOR CLASS TO BEGIN** in order to be considered "on time". Each tardy is recorded and submitted to our dean of students. Several consequences as outlined by Clifford Smart will result in cases of excessive tardiness.

Make-up Work/Late Assignments

It is the student's responsibility to make up ALL missing assignments. They will be marked in Skyward. Upon returning to school, students are expected to check with me to see what assignments they missed. When turning in late assignments please also write ABSENT or LATE (if the assignment just was not turned in on time) on the top of the missing assignment before turning it in.

General Classroom Rules

- Students should not bring gum or candy to class.
- The teacher dismisses the students, not the time on the clock.

- Hall passes (in planners) are allowed in emergency situations.
- Students will be assigned seats which might change from time to time.
- Tests will be communicated well in advance of when they will be given. For that reason, students will be expected to take the test the day they return, as long as the absence on test day was excused.
- Students will follow the district-wide dress code at all times.
- Unless otherwise directed personal electronic devices are not permitted. Acceptable times will be directly communicated by the teacher. Eating or drinking (other than water) is not acceptable unless otherwise communicated by the teacher.
- Students will be respectful of the learning environment, peers, and other staff members or guests in the classroom at all times. This includes the use of profanity or other put-downs, they will not be tolerated ever.
- Student work is to be original- students found to be violating academic integrity will receive a "zero" for the assignment or test. District and building policies on academic misconduct will be followed.

Extra Credit

Extra credit is not necessary if students turn in quality work on time. However, extra credit may be offered at teacher discretion. Extra credit is available only to students who have completed all previous assignments.

Ways to be Successful

Staying organized and on top of assignments/test dates is the most important aspect of success for middle school students. Potential road blocks to student success include not using their planner to track assignments, missing work, failure to do homework, and coming to class without needed materials and supplies.

You can help your child by doing the following:

- Make sure your child has supplies (especially folder, pens, pencils, colored pencils, and markers).
- Help your child <u>create and use an organizational system</u>. Encourage a weekly sorting of the folder making sure all papers for the class are in chronological order (so that they can be found easily).
- Check your child's planner as often as possible.
- Provide a supportive environment for homework.

Grading

A student's card-marking grade will be averaged from these areas in accordance with the district guidelines:

- Classwork and Homework
- Tests /Exams and Quizzes
- Projects and Participation

MATERIALS

You are expected to come to class prepared. There will not be many extra items provided to you in class, so make sure you bring what you need. Please bring the following items to class every day:

- Notebook and loose leaf paper
- Blue, Black, and Red pens
- Pencils
- Loose Leaf Paper
- Three Ring Binder or Folder to keep class materials/handouts in.
- School Planner
- Colored Pencils

HOMEWORK & ORGANIZATION

There will be homework on a regular basis to reinforce the content that we have covered in class. It is the responsibility of every student to complete their assignments or to communicate with their teacher if there is a question or problem. Using the planner that you were given at the beginning of the school year is a great way to stay organized. When **EXCUSED** absences occur students will have the number of days they missed to make-up any work.
